Companies mistakenly believe they are GDPR compliant

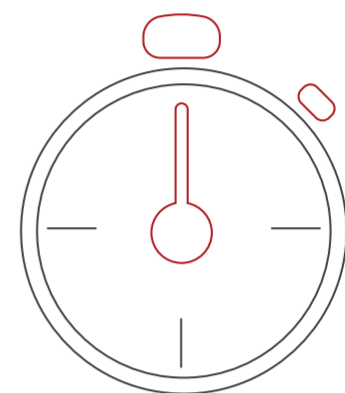
Almost one-third of organizations (31%) believe they are GDPR ready

Where are organizations going wrong?

GDPR Requirement: Firms must report a data breach within 72 hrs



61% admit it is difficult to identify and report a data breach within a 72 hour timeframe

GDPR Requirement: Firms must demonstrate state-of-the-art breach identification

Measures must be implemented to immediately establish if a personal data breach has taken place

48%

Almost half (48%) confessed they do not have full visibility when identifying personal data loss incidents

GDPR Requirement: Firms must limit data access to only appropriate parties



Half (50%) say that former employees can still access company data, exposing a critical security vulnerability

GDPR Requirement: The right to be forgotten

The GDPR will empower people to ask organizations to remove ALL instances of their data

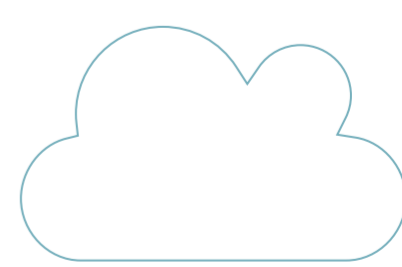
